





ne year ago, Debra and Richard Bryan plus their children, Emma, now 11, and Edward, ten, moved from London to Gloucestershire to lead a peaceful lifestyle and purchased a new-build property constructed with historic relevance and great attention to detail.

Property developer/builder Richard Deacon built the house in the style of British architect Edwin Lutyens, who pioneered architecture in India when it was part of the British Empire. He also designed several English country houses thereafter. "Richard is well-known in this area for building one-off properties to a very high standard," Debra says. "Passers-by don't notice this is a new-build as it doesn't look out of place on a street lined with period-style homes," she adds. Richard reflects on this further, "There's a huge demand for this type of place in the area, so I'm inclined to specialise in building properties with a 1920's-1930's feel. They've proved to be a very popular choice."

For the kitchen, Richard enlisted the expertise of Tim Buckingham at Woodchester Cabinet Makers. "Richard was very decisive and great to work with. He was specific in his choice of appliances and had them all delivered to our workshop where we spent time fitting them within made-to-measure cabinetry," recalls Tim. "When I first visited the house, it was a shell. I met the electrician and plumbers and discussed where the first fix of electrics and plumbing works should go. When the walls were plastered and decorated and the floors down, we installed the cabinetry in a dust-free environment. The final coat of paint was applied by brush on site - we never spray as that tends to look plastic. We pride ourselves on our natural wood and hand-painted finishes," he adds.



To complement the Shaker-style scheme, a split-level island was created, inspired by one seen in a magazine. The beauty of this kitchen is in this unit, which draws the eye to the centre of the room, while the granite over-hang provides a seated area for stools.

Its lower section features baskets produced by local craftsman and third generation thatcher Richard Kale, whose family has been creating fine hand-woven products since 1882, made from willow gathered on the banks of the River Severn. "We supply him with the oak frame and he drills holes and weaves the basket within it," Tim explains. "Having looked at many imported manufactured pieces, they're absolutely nowhere near the same fantastic quality," he adds.

Since moving in, the Bryans have acquired a new addition; golden retriever Pippa, and made a few adjustments to the kitchen. "I asked Tim to create dividers for the wide drawer that runs along the hob. He did this according to the sizes of my utensils," says Debra. "There's a section for ladles, spatulas and tongs plus a smaller part for ice-cream scoops and peelers. He even housed my knife block. It's so convenient to have all my essentials to hand when cooking," she adds. Another favourite of Debra's is the Fisher & Paykel DishDrawers. "I hadn't used them before, but they're fantastic. They eliminate the need to lean over in order to reach them. Plus, they speed up efficiency when entertaining as you can be filling one up as the other's in use," she explains.
